Aleisha McCarthy New Teacher of the Year

During Aliesha's first three years of teaching in Gettysburg, she was able to start an internship program to give students hand-on experiences and explore their career developments. Now after her first year of teaching in Redfield, she has started Educator's Rising and building the current FCCLA chapter. Here she has given students entrepreneurial experiences through partnering with local businesses through project-based learning experiences. This new "CEO in Training" project is something new to our state and she hopes to create an opportunity for her students to bring business back to the community.

Charlotte Mohling Lifetime Achievement & Hall of Fame Award

Mrs. Mohling teaches family and consumer sciences and technology and serves as the Curriculum Coordinator in her school. She also teaches career and technical education courses for the DIAL Virtual School. Advising two FCCLA chapters and Educators Rising allows her to challenge students to develop their leadership skills. Charlotte has held various positions demonstrating her leadership at the local, state, regional, and national level of ACTE. To ensure career success for all students, she developed a CTE career program in her school. In middle school they explore their personal interests and the 16 career clusters through hands-on activities in a fullyear, required CTE/FCS course. At the end of the year, a Personal Learning Plan is developed that will help guide their high school education experience. Through FCCLA students participate in community service projects and several other programs and activities.

SD FCCLA, Kris Brockhoft Award of Merit



The SD FCCLA (South Dakota Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America) organization under the leadership of Kris Brockhoft, State Advisor, is this year's recipient of this award. FCCLA helps youth develop leadership and workplace skills to prepare youth for both college and careers though peer education, community engagement, and the application of skills learned in the Family and Consumer Sciences (FCS) classroom. Since 1946, SD FCCLA (formerly FHA) members have been making a difference in their families, careers, and communities by addressing important personal, work, and societal issues through FCS education. Members have the opportunity to attend Fall Leadership Training, regional and state meetings, and serve on State Leadership teams. Various competitive events are offered. The National Leadership Conference is held in the summer where state winners and online winners compete. Community service projects are carried out by many of the local chapters. SD has had many top national winners and national officers over the years.

Connie Whistler Teacher of the Year

Since 2001, Connie has been teaching at the Bridgewater School and the consolidated Bridgewater/Emery School. She teaches a Workplace Technology course tailored for special needs students, working closely with the Special Education department to ensure the course meets the students' future needs. This year she will be teaching a Health Informatics course that DSU and she have been collaborating on, this course will be shared with other schools when completed. Connie has been instrumental as the CTE team leader to meet to discuss industry standards, career trends and curriculum updates. She has spearheaded fundraising efforts to offset the cost of the new CTE building in their school

Tiffany French Counseling & Career Development Award

Mrs. French completed her fourth year as the school counselor at the Custer Jr./Sr. High School. Before taking this position, she taught FCS for six years. Her understanding of the importance of CTE coursework in a student's education expands far beyond her experiences inside and outside of the classroom. Implementing a Career Exploration course for the eighth graders in 2022-23 has helped increase student focus and drive in achieving academic goals. Expanding the business and community partnerships is something that Tiffany is doing to discuss the vision, hope, and needs of the CTE offerings in her district. She also served as a committee member for the Custer CTE building expansion, where multiple grants have been awarded to grow and expand CTE offerings for students.

Adam Shaw Administrator of the Year

Adam has committed his professional life to education, serving in several capacities over the years. In 2013 he was hired as principal by Madison High School. His support and leadership of the CTE programs in the school has been outstanding. Receiving a large grant to expand and enhance the CTE offerings has made their high school a leader in the state. Two of the major improvements are the integration of Business and Community Partnerships and Work Based Learning. The medical program has flourished from a single PLTW Biomedical course to four additional medical-related courses plus a capstone experience with the local hospital that allows students the opportunity to go into surgery with a surgeon at the hospital and take part in the delivery of babies via c-sections.

Nikki Melius, Carl Perkins Community Service Award

Nikki has taught family and consumer sciences for the past 25 years in Faulkton. She plays a pivotal role in educating students by cultivating community relationships, networking with industries, and providing valuable opportunities for her students. Students gain hands-on experience in their chosen fields through the internship program she heads up. In her FCCLA chapter her students assume leadership roles, immerse themselves in community needs and view themselves as agents of change. Projects within the school, local hospitals, elderly living communities, business partners, and statewide projects allow the students to improve their leadership skills, develop community pride, and serves as a foundation for students to continue demonstrating throughout their adult lives.
