- 1. Awards Committee--Looking for members who would like to serve on the Awards Committee from all states and specifically from Arizona, Wyoming, and Colorado. Term begins July 1, 2025.
- 2. Legislative or Marketing Committee--Looking for members who would like to serve on the Legislative or Marketing Committees. Term begins July 1, 2025. (Apply by June 1, 2025)

It has been over 20 years since I last visited Washington, D.C., and while the city itself has changed, the legislative process remains much the same. When our team arrived, uncertainty was in the air — Congress had yet to approve a federal budget.

The South Dakota Career and Technical Education (CTE) team focused on two key priorities during our visit. First, we emphasized the importance of maintaining strong federal funding for secondary CTE programs. Our second priority was to highlight the importance of strengthening the alignment between education and workforce development systems.

This partnership is crucial in creating a direct pipeline of skilled, trained workers to meet the needs of our communities. Over the past three years, \$18.6 million has been dedicated to CTE-specific enhancements and expansions in South Dakota, a clear reflection of this vital connection.

While in D.C., we had the opportunity to meet with a member of Representative Dusty Johnson's staff. During this brief but meaningful meeting, each team member shared stories about how South Dakota students are gaining essential industry skills through CTE programs.

I highly encourage others to apply for the travel stipend and experience this opportunity to advocate for CTE firsthand. Your voice — and your story — truly matter!


